Update on drinking water supply and PFAS testing in the Jervis Bay Territory

Following the successful connection of the Jervis Bay Territory water pipeline to the Shoalhaven water network, the department will no longer be providing monthly updates on PFAS testing results for Lake Windermere.

With the new pipeline linking Vincentia and the Stoney Creek Reservoir, the community now has a new, reliable source of drinking water. As a result of this transition, responsibility for water quality testing now rests with Shoalhaven City Council, which conducts routine testing to ensure the continued safety and quality of the water supply.

This marks a significant milestone in strengthening the Territory's long-term water security and ensuring the community has access to high-quality, dependable supply.

Recent independent testing of JBT's water supply has confirmed quality improvements with turbidity levels well below previous levels recorded.

The department sincerely thanks the Jervis Bay Territory community for its ongoing patience and engagement throughout the delivery of this project.
