

Subject: Resignation from the Brisbane Airport Community Airspace Advisory Board (AAB) – David Diamond

Good afternoon, Kim,

As earlier discussed, I am formally advising of my decision to resign from the AAB, effective immediately. This decision has been made after careful and thorough consideration.

It has become evident that the AAB is unlikely to fulfil its stated objective of achieving improved aircraft noise outcomes for Brisbane communities. The Board currently lacks the necessary leadership, authority, and accountability from the responsible Minister, relevant government departments, and key industry stakeholders. Brisbane Airport Corporation, Airservices Australia, and the airlines continue to prioritise aircraft movement targets while failing to adequately address community concerns about noise and health impacts.

This conclusion has been reinforced by:

- Recent Senate Estimates hearings regarding aircraft noise and community safeguarding
- The inadequate Australian Government response to the Senate Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport References Committee's Final Report into the impact and mitigation of aircraft noise
- The draft Brisbane Airport Corporation (BAC) Master Plan, which proposes doubling aircraft movements without any credible noise abatement strategy or genuine commitment to mitigation measures

Furthermore, the Brisbane Aircraft Noise Action Plan, developed by Airservices Australia following the opening of the New Parallel Runway in July 2020, has not delivered any meaningful noise reduction outcomes, and there is no credible plan indicating future progress.

In its current form, the AAB functions largely as an engagement platform for government and industry stakeholders, creating an appearance of consultation rather than driving substantive action for affected communities.

Given these circumstances, I am unable to continue participating in a process that lacks the integrity and resolve required to deliver meaningful outcomes for those we represent.

Thank you for the opportunity to contribute to efforts aimed at improving noise and health outcomes for Brisbane residents.
