LGAs of South East Queensland: Logan




Population

341,985 population in 2020, to increase by 62.1% to 554.327 in 2041.

By 2041, Logan's 65+ population cohort will grow from **13.4%** to **18.5%** of the total population (Figure 1).

Dwelling approvals: Accounted for 10.1% of 12 LGA's new dwelling approvals between 2016 and 2021. 80.0% of these approvals were for new houses.

Housing affordability: In 2016, 8.2% of households experienced mortgage stress (1st), whilst 13.4% experienced rental stress (3rd).



Employment

Accounted for 6.0% of employed persons by LGA of work in 2016 (5th).

Largest employing industries: Retail trade (13.0%), Health care and social assistance (11.7%).



Occupations: Professionals are largest occupation (17.0%), followed by Clerical and administrative workers (14.0%).

Education: 22.3% of the working population has Bachelor's degree or higher qualification (7th).

• 1.5% active transport (12th)

• **4.2%** worked at home (5th)

Transport

- 87.0% private vehicle (3rd)
- 6.7% public transport (5th)

Connectivity

Average commuting distance for residents* of 20.8km.

39.9% of people work in the same LGA (12th).

2nd highest 45-minute job access, providing employed residents with access to 60.9% of SEQ jobs in 2019.

Liveability

Social infrastructure measures

- Health infrastructure (7th)
- Education (3rd)

5th highest walkability score.

Access to public space is 47.3%, the 5th lowest in SEQ.




in neighbouring LGAs within a 45-minute trip, this imbalance will likely generate significantly longer commute times.
