LGAs of South East Queensland: Redland




Population

160,331 population in 2020, to increase by **20.0%** to **192,431** in 2041.

By 2041, the 65+ population cohort will make up **28.3%** of the LGA's population (Figure 1). Only **55.9%** of people will be in the working age bracket in 2041.

Dwelling approvals: Accounted for 3.4% of 12 LGA's new dwelling approvals between 2016 and 2021. 71.0% of these approvals were new houses.

Housing affordability: : In 2016, 7.3% of households experienced mortgage stress (6th) whilst 11.1% experienced rental stress (8th).



Employment

Accounted for 2.7% of employed persons by LGA of work in 2016 (8th).

Largest employing industries: Health care and social assistance (15.4%), Retail trade (13.6%).



Occupations: Professionals is the largest occupation (17.9%), followed by Community and personal service workers (14.2%).

Education: 22.0% of the working population has a Bachelor's degree or higher qualification (8th).

Transport

- 83.6% private vehicle (8th)
- **8.0%** public transport (3rd)
- 2.1% active transport (10th)
- **5.6%** worked at home (8th)



Connectivity

Average commuting distance for residents of 19.3km.

42.9% of people work in the same LGA (11th).

3rd highest 45-minute job access, providing employed residents with access to 50.7% of SEQ jobs in 2019.



Social infrastructure measures

- Health infrastructure (10th)
- Education (6th)

6th highest walkability score.

Access to public space is 62.9%, the highest in SEQ in 2018.


