As some initial quotes were wrongly submitted as inclusive of GST, the total project cost was revised downwards to \$26,003 (from \$26,742). SCP funding was also reduced accordingly by \$739.

Application initially contained an activity expenditure line relating to Marketing: Activities that are not directly related to capital projects, such as provision of services and support activities are ineligible for funding under the Programme Guidelines (4.1.2). Applicant's proposed \$2,000 inkind for Marketing and Promotion activities for the Cage project fall into this category. Applicant advised of this and suggested either de-scoping or cash contribution.

Applicant replied 22 March that they would contribute cash instead of \$2,000 inkind. Revised expenditure list accepted with cash contribution incorporated into fitout items such as gyprock, battens etc. and a reduced SCP funding contribution.

Based on this, the total project cost has been further reduced to \$24,003 and SCP funding reduced by a further \$632. Compared with initial application, the SCP funding has been reduced by a total of \$1,371 and project total reduced by \$2,739.

Applicant also advised they may be able to purchase a second container included in the price quoted for one.
