Good Afternoon David and Pip,

I refer to our conversation yesterday and provide the following advice;

1. The Journalist FIO requests should be rejected based on the status of an active investigation by the AFP and the potential compromise of witnesses and the potential destruction of evidence.
2. For Senate Estimates you can reference that this is an active investigation being undertaken by the AFP and if pushed can state that advice from the AFP is that it is too early to speculate on any criminality. The decision to reference any internal code of conduct enquiry is an internal decision for your department.
3. There is no need to stop any internal code of conduct enquiry while AFP reviews documents and identifies persons they wish to interview.

It is my understanding that this advice is also likely to be referred to your department by AFP Canberra. This is the advice I provided to them today and they have prepared a back pocket brief for AFP Senate Estimates.

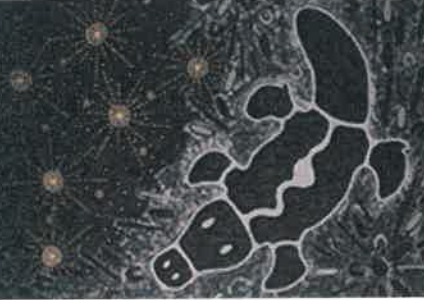

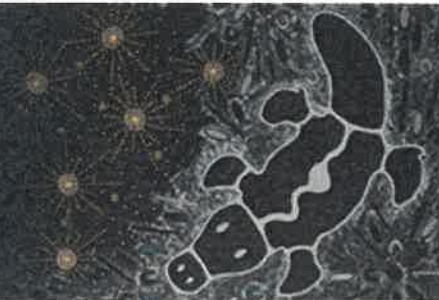

Good Afternoon Pip,

As discussed. I recommend we advise the AFP would like to be provided copies of the APS Code Of Conduct review being conducted by Dr Thom (related to the Leppington acquisition) and the Independent audit of the Leppington Triangle purchase by Mr Harrison (expected completion end of March) *prior to public release and AFP clearance provided prior to public release*. The purpose of obtaining these reports is for the investigative team to identify whether further avenues of enquiry need to be initiated with respect to the Leppington Triangle acquisition and preserve any evidence that might be identified in the reports.

The other reviews, being the code of conduct review by Ms Deegan (probity issues) and the Independent review of the Western Sydney Unit by KPMG, do not appear to relate to the Leppington Triangle acquisition and therefore have no bearing on the AFP's investigation. The AFP has no objection to the release of these two reviews.

To clarify, the AFP's preference is that information, material or evidence relating to the investigation into the procurement of the Leppington Triangle is not provided until the investigation is finalised.

However, the AFP does not object to information, material or evidence relating to the second code of conduct review by Ms Deegan or the Independent review of the Western Sydney Unit by KPMG as this is unrelated to the procurement of the Leppington Triangle.

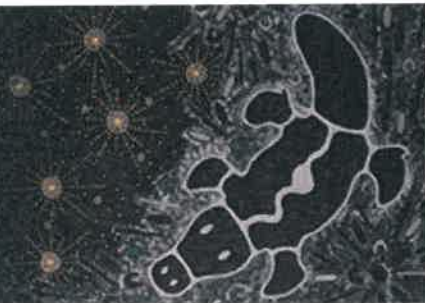

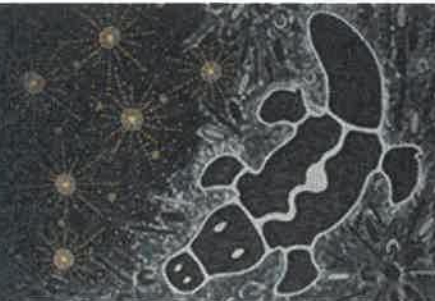
