1. s22(1)(a)(ii) this briefing seeks your agreement to a number of actions to finalise the delivery arrangements for election commitments included in the Investing in Our Communities (IIOC) program and the Priority Community Infrastructure Program (PCIP).

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Complex PCIP projects unlikely to be delivered within current program parameters

- 6. The department has also identified through discussions with grantees a small number of larger, more complex projects in PCIP that are unlikely to be able to be delivered under the current parameters of PCIP (largely due to the project construction timelines continuing beyond the program appropriation period). Details of these projects are included at **Attachment A**.
- 7. To ensure the commitments can be delivered, it is recommended you seek authority from the Prime Minister for these projects to be delivered through an alternate mechanism —proposed to be through the Federation Funding Agreement arrangements, subject to discussion and

Dear Prime Minister

I am writing to you to seek your urgent agreement to a small number of actions to finalise the list of commitments within the Investing in Our Communities (IIOC) program and the Priority Community Infrastructure Program (PCIP). As both programs close to new applications on 30 November 2023, I would appreciate your consideration and agreement to the proposals in this letter as soon as possible, to ensure all of our election commitments can be delivered.

In addition, there are a small number of larger, more complex projects under PCIP where the commitments are unlikely to be able to be delivered under the current parameters of the program. For these commitments (outlined in <u>Attachment A</u>), I seek your authority to begin processes to deliver the projects through an alternate mechanism — likely to be through the Federation Funding Agreement arrangements, subject to discussion and negotiation with the relevant State Ministers.
