The purpose of the project is to upgrade sub-standard change room facilities at the Northern end of Trevor Barker Beach Oval, Beach Road in Sandringham. It has been costed at \$\frac{847G(1)(a)}{2}\$. The Sandringham Football Club has been based at the venue for 95 years and we are well advanced in negotiations with Bayside City Council to extend the lease for another 15 years. The existing change facilities were developed approximately 50 years ago and do not cater appropriately for women and girls who play and umpire Australian Rules football. The upgraded facilities will be female-friendly, have multiple change rooms and individual shower and toilet cubicles. The infrastructure upgrade is vital to our future. Without it, we simply cannot meet the increase in demand for girls and women's football. We want to be a part of the social and cultural change in sport. Gender equality in sport is good for everyone boys, girls, and the broader community as it can help teach the values of fairness, equality, and respect.

At Sandringham Football Club, we firmly believe that sport should be for all and that girls and women should have equal opportunities and pathways as boys and men do. Historically women and girls have had to fight for their place in sport. In recent years, barriers have come down and gains have been made. With the growth of womens sport, in particular Australian Football since the introduction of AFL Womens in 2017, our facilities are no longer adequate. They simply do not meet the needs of our female athletes and officials. For players, there is currently only one open space for players to get changed in. This is the same for the umpires. Each set of rooms only has one toilet cubicle, an open urinal and there are no private showers instead, its just four shower heads side-by-side like what you may find at the beach. Female players and umpires are either having to come to the ground ready to play/umpire or get changed in their cars, or just get changed in front of everyone. They are unable to shower at the venue due to lack of privacy and often need to use the public toilets outside the change rooms as the single toilet in the change rooms isnt enough for an entire team of female athletes. Portable toilets are also sometimes used which is unsatisfactory. Our venue attracts female athletes of all ages, from grassroots up to Victorian Football League Womens (VFLW) and hosts teams from all over Victoria. Our venue is used by community clubs including those in the Victorian Amateur Football Association (VAFA), as well as talent pathway teams such as Sandringham Dragons and Western Jets, through to our VFLW side. We also host diversity games including the NextGen Unite Cup a competition played by South Sudanese women and men from across Victoria. Throughout this day, football, music and African food brings people together to raise funds to support mental health in the South Sudanese women and men from female players, we also have female umpires using our facilities that are shared with men across all levels of the g

Moving forward if the venue was to not be upgraded, we may find it hard to retain and attract female players due to the lack of female friendly facilities. Were a community based not-for-profit organisation that relies on the generosity of businesses and the local community. Since 2019, we have had our own VFLW team that is seen as a pathway for girls from the Bayside and surrounding area to play in the second-tier competition for Australian Rules football. We work closely with South Metro Junior Football League (SMJFL), the Coates Talent League, local clubs and Auskick centres. Our project is of benefit to the broader community as it will provide an inclusive, welcoming, safe space that promotes gender equality. We want to contribute to the development of female football by providing facilities that promote a positive experience for women and girls participating in sport. Statistics show that teenage girls often drop out of sport for a variety of reasons. We want to keep them playing. Having double change rooms will also provide greater access, also provide greater access and flexibility to better cater for double headers where mens and womens games can be scheduled back-to-back ensuring increased visibility of the womens team to the broader community. It is really important for boys and young men to see girls and women playing sport and thriving as it formulates their views on equality. This project wont happen without funding and whilst costly, it is necessary. The anticipated budget for the project is \$47G(1)(a) from the Play our Way funding opportunity. 

The development of football facilities is a key objective of AFL Victoria as we seek to provide sufficient numbers of well located, accessible and welcoming football facilities that support the growth of our game and our football leagues, clubs and schools.

We are pleased to be able to confirm that the AFL interest in partnering with the Sandringham Football Club to redevelop the change rooms and amenities in the Northern Pavilion at Trevor Barker Beach Oval to cater for female participants. The existing facilities are outdated and do not provide equitable facilities to support female participation.

This project will support new and existing participation levels and assist with the rapid growth being experienced in female football in both umpiring and playing. In 2019, we had over 1,000 female teams across Victoria playing football.

This project aligns very strongly to our National and Victorian goal of enhancing elite, state league and talent infrastructure, namely by Enhancing State League and talent pathway venues to inspire and support our very best and continuing to support the expansion of female football through gender neutral amenities, pavilion expansion projects and oval capacity building initiatives.

The AFL has conditionally approved a contribution of up to sards the Trevor Barker Beach Oval redevelopment project. This contribution is conditional upon the project achieving full financial backing on or before the 31 December 2025, along with a new lease guaranteeing all year usage for our sport's key user groups at the venue.

The Value of an AFL Community Football Club world first research project has found that for every one dollar invested in a community football club, at least \$4.40 is returned in social value. It found that it does not matter where you live, how long or how often you are involved in a football club, or whether you are a player, coach, volunteer or a supporter, people involved with a football club experience greater social connectedness, wellbeing and self-reported physical and mental health than the general population as a result of being involved in a football club.

### Reason for score:

Applicant has answered most criteria to an average level. Responses show a valid link between upgrading the facilities and objectives of the grant program. By providing safe, high-quality, and sustainable facilities fosters a supportive environment and will ensure opportunities for women and girls to actively participate at this club, although value for money is questionable - noting the women-specific component of the renovations is unclear. If this progresses to the ITA phase, more clarity on the works would be required to ensure women/girls are the primary focus and ensure the project is being developed specifically for/to benefit women/girls, as the project indicates it would be upgrading the facilities and is not clear whether this is the female or male facilities also, or whether unisex facilities would be installed in replace of the existing facilities.

### Weaknesses/Information that would further benefit/taken into account for score:

- Unclear how the 'need' has been chosen or defined. Application provides insufficient evidence that the proposed activity is a strong/well regarded solution. No evidence has been provided of engagement with females members or the broader community in shaping the project to ensure the project is wanted and supported and delivers a meaningful outcome that meets their needs.
- Although the need for this project is clearly high, there has not been a clear description of the proposed works provided. It is unclear what
   'double change rooms' for example indicate, and details such as the size, how many female cubicles and changerooms would this project provide,
   and how many females would this impact, would strengthen this application.
- If application progresses to the ITA phase, clarification on the budget/ funding breakdown to ensure the works are for females would be required.
- Application could be strengthened by providing data on the number of women and girls (members) who would benefit from this project.
- Clarification on the works would need to be sought. Investing in updating and providing female amenities would encourage girls and women to
  participate at the site and will have an enduring impact beyond the funding period, however the information provided groups the facilities

This project is updating existing infrastructure for mixed club that requires an upgrade but the club will continue operating as per usual and potentially seeks to service a broader population. Clarification on the works would need to be sought. Application provides insufficient evidence that the proposed activity is a strong/well regarded solution. No evidence of engagement with the community in shaping the project - on how many members of the community or if that engagement was with women and girls or the broader community.

Project timeframes appear to be realistic.

Clear description of who owns premises has been provided - A letter of support from Bayside City Council.

Assessment Criterion 2: Why is your project needed?

Rating (0-10):

### Assessor comments:

Sandringham Football Club firmly believe that sport should be for all and that girls and women should have equal opportunities and pathways as boys and men do. Historically women and girls have had to fight for their place in sport. In recent years, barriers have come down and gains have been made. Response shows a sophisticated understanding of the barriers to participation that need to be overcome.

Applicant states with the growth of women's sport, in particular Australian Football since the introduction of AFL Womens in 2017, the clubs facilities are no longer adequate and do not meet the needs of female athletes and officials. There is currently only one open space for players and umpires to get changed in. Each set of rooms only has one toilet cubicle, an open urinal and there are no private showers instead, its just four shower heads side-by-side like what you may find at the beach. Female players and umpires are either having to come to the ground ready to play/umpire or get changed in their cars, or just get changed in front of everyone. They are unable to shower at the venue due to lack of privacy and often need to use the public toilets outside the change rooms as the single toilet in the change rooms isnt enough for an entire team of female athletes. The umpire change rooms do not provide privacy for female umpires to change or use the shower and toilet amenities. Auskick participants prior to VFL games can't have access to rooms either as there is only the one set being used by the men's teams. Portable toilets are also sometimes used which is unsatisfactory. Although the need for this project is clearly high, there has not been a clear description of the proposed works provided. Further details such as the size, how many female cubicles and changerooms would this project provide, and how many females would this impact, would strengthen this application.

Sandringham Football Clubs venue attracts female athletes of all ages, from grassroots up to Victorian Football League Womens (VFLW) and hosts teams from all over Victoria. The venue is used by community clubs including those in the Victorian Amateur Football Association (VAFA), as well as talent pathway teams such as Sandringham Dragons and Western Jets, through to the VFLW side. Sandringham Football Club also host diversity games including the NextGen Unite Cup a competition played by South Sudanese women and men from across Victoria. Throughout this day, football, music, and African food brings people together to raise funds to support mental health in the South Sudanese community. Aside from female players, the club also have female umpires using the facilities that are shared with men across all levels of the game including VFL/VFLW, talent pathway, VAFA and community games. This demonstrates positive attraction, engagement and retention strategies the Club has fostered and indicates a supportive environment for female athletes.

Bayside City Council has drafted a Fair Access Policy to address known barriers experienced by women and girls in accessing and using community sports infrastructure, which highlights the need for female-friendly facilities. The Change our Game Fair Access Policy Roadmap strives to level the playing field for women and girls in community sport, acknowledging that everyone has the right to fully participate and reach their full potential. This requires fair access to change rooms. Without the upgrades to the change rooms, women and girls will continue to face unfair circumstances and experience more barriers to sport than men and boys. Sandringham Football Clubs value women's sport and want to do everything they can to encourage girls and women to play the great game of Aussie Rules. This indicates the club fosters female involvement and participation and encourages further participation and shows how the infrastructure will provide a dedicated and safe space — provides clear 'policy line of sight' between strategic need and the strategy of the grant activity.

Unclear how the 'need' has been chosen or defined - no evidence of local collaboration in determining issue and solution.

### Assessor comments:

Applicant states they are the best placed program to support the redevelopment of the change rooms in the Northern Pavilion at Trevor Barker Beach Oval. Without this funding, the facility will continue to not meet the needs and expectations of current and future female players and umpires and may find it hard to retain and attract female players due to the lack of female friendly facilities. Although the need for this project is clearly high, \$47G(1)(a)

Applicant states this project is of benefit to the broader community as it will provide an inclusive, welcoming, safe space that promotes gender equality. Sandringham Football Club want to contribute to the development of female football by providing facilities that promote a positive experience for women and girls participating in sport. Statistics show that teenage girls often drop out of sport for a variety of reasons and the club want to keep them playing. Having double change rooms will also provide greater access, also provide greater access and flexibility to better cater for double headers where men's and women's games can be scheduled back-to-back ensuring increased visibility of the women's team to the broader community. s47G(1)(a)

Applicant states the importance for boys and young men to see girls and women playing sport and thriving as it formulates their views on equality and this project won't happen without funding. To ensure the project can be completed applicant is requesting sa7G(1)(a) from the Play our Way funding opportunity. Other funding partners include sa7G(1)(a) from the AFLs Australian Football Facilities Fund, and Sandringham Football Club have a partnership with MC Building to keep costs as low as possible and ensure our plans are in line with our Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) framework. Loyal sponsors and local community members are also looking to support. The cocontributions and the community support provides confidence in the project's outcome and this support would potentially minimise risk.

Sandringham Football Club are in discussion with all levels of government, with both State and Local Governments also looking at our project and considering their contribution. The Sandringham Football Club has funds and revenue streams in place to keep up the maintenance of the facility. Based in the heart of Bayside, in a high growth area for female sport, the current facilities are not meeting the needs of the community and girls and women deserve better. Applicant states they need this grant to redress the imbalance and provide a

Providing modernised, accessible, and updated facilities will assist in encouraging more females to use the club, however no clear evidence has been provided to demonstrate the project would prioritise or focus the upgrades on women and girls, as it is indicated that all the facilities are to be updated, including the males. It is unclear if the entire works will be for women/girls or what percentage of the facilities will be for women/girls.

Sandringham Football Club is a community based not-for-profit organisation that relies on the generosity of businesses and the local community. This demonstrates the need for funding – the club are a not-for-profit organisation relying on external funding.

Applicant states since 2019, Sandringham Football Club have had our own VFLW team that is seen as a pathway for girls from the Bayside and surrounding area to play in the second-tier competition for Australian Rules football, and work closely with South Metro Junior Football League (SMJFL), the Coates Talent League, local clubs and Auskick centres.
