In line with changes to national protocols, people in the Indian Ocean Territories will no longer be directed to isolate at home if testing positive to COVID-19, from 14 October 2022.

COVID-19 is still present in the community, despite this shift in mandatory requirements. We encourage everyone to take precautions to protect others and stop the spread of COVID-19. Continue maintaining a safe distance from others, practise good hand hygiene, wear a mask in public places, cover your coughs and sneezes, stay home if sick and get tested if you develop symptoms.

People who are sick and particularly anyone with confirmed COVID-19 are still strongly encouraged to stay home while they are symptomatic and avoid high-risk settings like healthcare unless requiring urgent medical treatment. IOTHS will continue to implement COVID controls and measures at the health service to protect staff and patients.
