INDIAN OCEAN TERRITORIES FAMILIES BENEFIT FROM STUDENT ASSISTANCE PAYMENTS

Families with school-aged children in the Indian Ocean Territories are now benefiting from hundreds of dollars in financial support, thanks to the Australian and Western Australian Governments.

The governments have worked in partnership to extend the Cook Government's new WA Student Assistance Payment (WASAP) to Christmas and Cocos (Keeling) Islands, supporting families to pay for the extra costs of their child's schooling in the current economic environment.

The payment provides cost-of-living relief payments of \$250 for each secondary student and \$150 for primary and kindergarten students, helping to pay for school essentials, such as books, IT equipment, uniforms, stationery, sports and music – as well as food and groceries.

Eligibility will be validated through the student's unique WA student number (WASN), which can be found on a student's school report or NAPLAN results. The ServiceWA app is the fastest and most convenient way to claim the payment for all students from kindergarten to Year 12 who are enrolled in a school on island.

Parents and carers can log into the app using their Digital Identity (myGovID), with applications closing on 28 June. For support in downloading and using the ServiceWA app, head to WA.gov.au/servicewaapp
