

Grant Funding	\$1.2 million in grant funding is available for up to 23 Mobile Tower sites, with funding available for up to:
	<ol> <li>50% of the total capital costs of each Battery Upgrade project;</li> <li>50% for each Automatic Transfer Switch (ATS) Upgrade project;</li> <li>50% for each combined Battery Upgraded and Automatic Transfer Switch Upgrade project.</li> </ol>
Eligible Applicants	Eligible applicants must have an ABN and be either a:
	<ol> <li>Mobile Network Operator (MNO), or</li> <li>Mobile Network Infrastructure Provider (MNIP).</li> </ol>
Eligible Activities	Activities that comprise an eligible Resilience Upgrade are:
<ul><li>Automatic Transfer Switch (ATS)</li><li>Battery</li></ul>	<ol> <li>Installation of an ATS <u>and</u> upgrade to battery back-up power to at least 20 hours where neither is at an eligible site; or</li> <li>Upgrade to <u>only</u> battery back-up power to at least 20 hours where an ATS is already at an eligible site; or</li> </ol>
Upgrades	3. Installation of <u>only</u> an ATS where at least 20 hours of battery back-up is already at an eligible site.

## Category

### **Proposed Design**

For the purposes of the MNHP Perth Hills Round, an ATS is a device that automatically switches electrical power from a primary source to a backup source, ensuring a continuous power supply without manual intervention.

For the purposes of the MNHP Perth Hills Round, a battery upgrade can involve an upgrade to an existing battery system at a site and/or the use or installation of a supplementary battery back-up system attached to a site. Proposed battery upgrades must result in a minimum of 20 hours of battery backup.

## **Eligible Site**

An existing mobile tower site must be located in the regional and peri-urban areas of Perth Hills region and Local Government Areas (LGAs) of:

- Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale;
- City of Armadale;
- City of Swan;
- City of Kalamunda; and
- Shire of Mundaring.

For consistency and ease of understanding, eligible Regional and Peri-Urban areas for this Round are determined using the same definition as Round 3 of this Program. A map of eligible areas is available on the Department's website.

## Eligible Expenditure

Only expenditure incurred on eligible grant activities related to the approved Resilience Upgrade project will be funded.

#### **Assessment Criteria**

Proposed projects will be assessed according to three merit criteria:

- 1. Cost of Proposed Resilience Upgrade Project [per hour of battery life]
- 2. Benefits to the Community
- 3. Capacity, Capability and Resources of the Applicant.

Proposals will be grouped into three tranches based on the three types of Eligible Activities, with Tranche 1 prioritised to ensure that funding is directed to sites with the most need for resilience upgrades.

- **Tranche 1:** Installation of an ATS and upgrades to battery back-up power to at least 20 hours where neither exist at an eligible site;
- Tranche 2: Upgrades to only battery back-up power to at least 20 hours where an ATS is already present at an eligible site; or
- Tranche 3: Installation of only an ATS where at least 20 hours of battery backup is already present at an eligible site.

Proposed projects will also be assessed for value with relevant money.
