2024 INDEPENDENT REVIEW OF THE NORTHERN AUSTRALIA INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY ACT 2016

Regional Development Australia (RDA) Kimberley thanks the Australian Government for the opportunity to submit feedback to the 2024 Independent Review of the *Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF) Act 2016*.

RDA Kimberley is a not-for-profit organisation part of the Australian Government's RDA Network. We have an active and facilitative role in the Kimberley to improve regional development outcomes, achieved through collaboration across all levels of government, private sector, and community. Our vision is to grow a strong and confident regional economy that harnesses the Kimberley's competitive advantages, seizes economic opportunities, and attracts investment (see **Attachment 1** Map of the Kimberley).

The Kimberley has received only 4% of the \$4.4 billion committed by NAIF since its establishment.

Only two projects in the Kimberley have had loans approved through NAIF. This includes:

- Kimberley Mineral Sands' Thunderbird Mineral Sands Project in the West Kimberley (up to \$160 million).
- Kimberley Cotton Company's Cotton Gin Project in the East Kimberley (up to \$34 million).

This clearly indicates that NAIF needs a different operating model to meet its mandate in the Kimberley.

Proponents have provided feedback to RDA Kimberley that the NAIF application and due diligence process is lengthy, cost prohibitive, and requires a scale or 'shovel readiness' that sits at odds with the greenfield nature of many development opportunities in the region, which continue to remain unrealised. In the Kimberley, there is a major funding gap for businesses between the Kimberley Development Commission's Regional Economic Development grants (maximum grant value \$250,000) and NAIF (often minimum \$10 million project value).

RDA Kimberley understands that the Australian Government and the WA State Government are exploring a small loans partnership, similar to the Northern Territory Local Jobs Fund's Territory Infrastructure Loans Program. The concept of a small loan facility would suit and benefit the Kimberley and its scale of emerging projects and investment (see **Attachment 2** Kimberley Projects Under Investigation (Non-Government)). These projects range from medical biotechnology manufacturing to bespoke education models for remote Aboriginal communities. RDA Kimberley has provided this feedback to the WA State Government Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development for consideration as part of the initiative investigations.

Announcing a government supported small loans scheme for Northern WA is also likely to be a catalyst for new project development in the Kimberley. It will play a critical role given that the lack of access to institutional lending continues to be a major inhibitor to private investment and business growth in the region.

RDA Kimberley strongly advocates for a government supported small loans scheme for our region as part of the 2024 Review and offers assistance as a NAIF delivery partner. There is no NAIF representative based in the region. RDA Kimberley is well placed to support NAIF with this initiative with strong on-the-ground stakeholder connectivity and strategic regional development capability.

Please note, that RDA Kimberley supports the submission from the Northern RDA Alliance which highlights that proponents in Northern Australia would also strongly benefit from the availability of funding for business case development and feasibility studies. This is another recognised funding gap which is inhibiting project development and attraction of funding.


