

# Administrator's update

The Norfolk Island Governance Committee members have a significant amount to work through over the next few weeks to come to a consensus on a new governance model to present to Government.

It is crucial to ensure the new governing body is in the best position financially to succeed from the beginning. The committee are meeting next week and then again at the start of June for a week-long workshop to build an agreed model to take to the Minister by early July.

We will continue to keep the community updated through both the Wednesday community engagement sessions, and regular communiques as this critical work progresses.

While we have a very tight timeline in providing a recommendation to the Minister, a new governance model will not be established before the end of Council administration. A key consideration in planning transitional arrangements will be employment security for current Council staff.



## Minister McBain returns to Norfolk

It was great to have Minister for Territories, Kristy McBain MP, back on Norfolk Island earlier this month, to discuss governance matters in person.

During her visit, Minister McBain sat down with the Norfolk Island Governance Committee (NIGC) to provide direction in respect of the new model of governance for the island, as well as reaffirming the necessity of a solid revenue base to fund and deliver local government services to Norfolk Island. All parties agree on the need to have the new governance body established as soon as possible.

The Minister also met with Council on current priorities and transitional arrangements in the lead-up to December this year.

Minister McBain made time to tour a range of key infrastructure projects funded by the Australian Government including the Kingston stage one sewer and roads, Cascade works, and Slaughter Bay seawall.

The Minister reinforced the Australian Government's ongoing investment in Norfolk Island's sustainable future.

It was invaluable that the Minister could make the visit and talk directly to the NIGC.

# Happy birthday to new centenarian Ralph Weslake

On May 6, I had the honour of hosting Ralph Weslake and his extended family for an afternoon tea at Government House to celebrate Ralph's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

He is also the first man in recent times on the island to make 100! Well done, Ralph.

# Raise the roof – Government House roof repairs almost complete

Last year, the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts brought on Jordi Construction to undertake some essential roof works on Government House. These works are now nearing the finish line, all within the planned timelines.

Government House is one of Australia's greatest historical buildings, and an icon of Norfolk Island, which is why particular care has been taken to make sure the heritage value of the building, and the surrounding area, was not damaged during the works on the roof. Instead, the roof works enhance the beauty and history of the building, which will remain a bastion of our proud heritage for decades to come.

These works would not have been possible without the ongoing collaboration between the contractor and the local suppliers on island, a clear demonstration of what can be achieved when we work together to get things done.

The final materials will soon be delivered, and we are working towards finishing up both the internal and external refurbishment works.



**Progressing the new residential aged care facility** The Department and its contractors are working on design and costings for the Norfolk Island Residential Aged Care (RAC) project.

The 16-bed RAC project is currently being designed to a 30% concept level, to inform development of a detailed cost estimate. The aged care home project will also include construction of a new ancillary support services building and mortuary for the Norfolk Island Health and Residential Aged Care Service.

KPMG has been engaged to provide project management and contract administration services for the design phase, managing GHD which is undertaking engineering and design services. The 30% Concept Design and costings are scheduled to be finalised by mid-year. Following Departmental review of the costings, the project will be progressed through further design stages. Community consultations and public exhibitions will occur throughout this period. We will update the community on next steps and consultations timeframes as the project progresses.
