**Topic:** Planned electricity outage Wreck Bay Village – Tuesday 24 June 2025

### Planned power outage in Wreck Bay Village

The Jervis Bay Territory Operations Team, in collaboration with ARA Electrical Services, has organised the installation of a series of dropout fuses and isolation points to enhance the reliability of the Jervis Bay Territory's electrical network.

To install these protective measures, we need to turn off the power to the Wreck Bay Village on **Tuesday 24 June 2025** from **08:00am to 04:00pm**. The power will not be turned off earlier than this time

We will work with ARA to minimise the length of this outage, however unexpected issues may keep the power off longer than planned. We will keep the community updated if the outage is cancelled or restoration of services are delayed.

Thank you for your understanding and patience while we carry out this important work.

#### If you're a life support customer:

- If you require your life support equipment during the outage, please make sure you have enough back-up supply or are able to make alternative arrangements. If you have any questions or concerns, please call the JBT office on 4442 2200.

#### Tips on how to prepare for a planned power outage:

- Landline phones and internet won't operate without mains power, so we recommend having an alternative mobile phone available.
- Unplug sensitive appliances such as computers, laptops and TVs to avoid the risk of damage when power is restored.
- Unplug electric heaters or air conditioners so they are off when power is restored.
- Adjust your fridge and freezer to coldest setting.
- If you have automatic garage doors or security gates, make sure you know how to operate them manually, or leave your car parked outside.
- Leave a light on inside your house, so you know when power is restored.
- Alarm systems may not operate during the power outage or may need to be reprogrammed once power is restored.
- You may need to reset water timers after the outage.
