Register of available capacity for Australian international airlines

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Preface to register

Section 49 of the *International Air Services Commission Act 1992* requires an up to date register of all available capacity, under Australia's air services agreements and arrangements, to be kept and made available for inspection. The Register is maintained by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts ('the Department').

This copy of the Register is made available to the general public but it is not authoritative. Persons seeking to rely on the contents of the Register should consult the original Register maintained by the Department.

Clarification of any conditions relating to the capacity, aircraft substitution formulae or wording used in the entries in the Register may be had by reference to the texts of air services agreements and arrangements held in the Data-Room established by the Department. Access to the Data-Room is available only to potential applicants before the International Air Services Commission following signature of a confidentiality undertaking by them. This is because some of the agreements and arrangements contain commercial-in-confidence or confidential material. Notification that a company is a potential applicant before the International Air Services Commission is provided by the Commission to the Department.

In examining the Register, it should be noted that:

- references to frequencies of flights mean round-trips unless otherwise specified;
- points which can be served in the foreign countries are as set out in Australia's bilateral air services arrangements with those countries (this information is available from consulting the documents in the Data-Room);
- in determining traffic rights which are available on routes between second and third countries, reference should be made to the terms of Australia's arrangements with both countries (this information is available in the Data-Room);
- while most of Australia's air services arrangements with foreign countries allow for the designation
 of more than one Australian airline (multiple designation), some arrangements allow designation of
 one Australian airline only (single designation). The Register entries for single designation routes
 include a note to this effect;
- the Register indicates where a designated Australian airline is operating (or may soon operate) on a single designation route, as this would prevent another Australian airline from operating on the route. On some single designation routes there may be a currently designated Australian airline which does not have a capacity allocation. This would not prevent another Australian airline receiving an allocation of capacity. However, intending applicants should make inquiries of the Department regarding current designations, particularly on single designation routes, and the steps which may need to be taken before a new designation is made and operations may commence;
- where Australia's air services arrangements allow for multiple designation, the relevant Register entries include a note to this effect; and
- in several of Australia's air services arrangements which include aircraft substitution formulae, some latitude may be allowed for airlines to exceed marginally the capacity entitlement (this information is available in the Data-Room).

The information contained in this Register is current at the date indicated for each entry.

Entry last amended on 25 May 2012

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

2800 seats per week

Freight services

7 weekly services with any aircraft type.

Code sharing

The designated airlines of Australia are entitled to perform any of their agreed services, including both combination and dedicated freighter services, through code sharing, blocked space and other cooperative services arrangements, with any airline. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Austria

Entry last amended on 12 August 2009

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

Unrestricted capacity, frequency and aircraft type

Freight services:

A designated airline may determine the route, frequency of service, capacity and aircraft type to be operated.

Code sharing

Capacity offered by an Australian airline as the non-operating airline on services operated by other airlines will not be counted against any Australian capacity entitlements.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

A designated airline of Australia, whether as the operating or non-operating airline, may enter into cooperative marketing arrangements such as blocked space or code sharing with:

- (a) an airline or airlines of Australia;
- (b) an airline or airlines of Austria; or
- (c) an airline or airlines of a third country.

Capacity offered by a designated airline of Australia as the non-operating airline on services operated by other airlines will not be counted against any Australian capacity entitlements.

Capacity operated by a designated airline of Australia as the operating carrier will be counted against the capacity entitlements outlined above under "Passenger services".

Note: A number of conditions apply to co-operative marketing operations. Airlines considering operations on a co-operative basis with other airlines should seek further information from the Department.

Azerbaijan

Entry last amended on 9 January 2018

Available capacity

Passenger services

7 services each way each week with any aircraft type to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

Unrestricted frequency, capacity and aircraft type for services to/from all points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney

Freight services

The designated airline(s) may operate unrestricted frequencies and aircraft capacity using any type of aircraft.

Code sharing

The designated airlines of Australia have the right, over all or part of their route, to enter into code share, blocked space or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the marketing and/or operating airlines with any other airline, including airlines of the same side and of a third country.

The Bahamas

Entry last amended on 9 January 2018

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

The arrangements do not provide capacity for own-operated services.

Code sharing

The nominated airlines of Australia have the right to enter into code share arrangements on routes to/from The Bahamas with any other airline, including other Australian airlines, those of The Bahamas or of third parties.

Bahrain

Entry last amended on 18 July 2003

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

12 frequencies per week to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

The designated airline or airlines may determine the frequency of service, capacity and aircraft type to be operated from points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

Freight services

The designated airline or airlines may determine the frequency, capacity and aircraft type to be operated.

Code sharing

Any designated airline of Australia may enter into code sharing arrangements, as the marketing and/or operating airline with another Australian airline or airlines, with a Bahrain airline or airlines, or with an airline or airlines of a third country. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Bangladesh

Entry last amended on 27 July 2012

No capacity available.

Freight services

7 frequencies each way each week with any aircraft type.

Code sharing

A designated airline of Australia may enter into code share arrangements, whether as the operating or marketing airline, with a designated airline of Bangladesh, a designated airline of Australia and/or an airline of a third country.

Belarus

Entry last amended on 11 June 2013

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

The arrangements do not provide capacity for own-operated services.

Code sharing

Airlines of Australia have the right to enter into code share arrangements, as the marketing airline, with any other airline, including other Australian airlines or of third parties.

Belgium

Entry last amended on 21 February 2011

7 services each way per week to/from Brisbane, Melbourne (including Avalon), Perth and Sydney:

Unrestricted capacity, frequency and aircraft type to and from all points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne (including Avalon), Perth and Sydney.

Freight services

7 services each way per week

Code sharing

The designated airline(s) of Australia can enter into code share, blocked space or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the marketing and/or operating airline with any other airline, including other designated Australian airlines and of third parties.

Botswana

Entry last amended on 11 December 2014

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

The arrangements do not provide capacity for own-operated services.

Code sharing

The nominated airlines of Australia have the right to enter into code share arrangements on routes to/from Botswana with any other airline, including other Australian airlines, those of Botswana or of third parties.

Brazil

Entry last amended on 24 July 2008

14 weekly frequencies

Freight services*

7 weekly frequencies

* Some of these frequencies may not be used for services between Guarulhos International Airport and points in Australia until the regulatory restraints in place in Brazil as of 8 July 2008, related to infrastructure at that airport are removed. This restriction applies to seven of the fourteen combination passenger and cargo services and four of the seven all cargo services.

Code sharing

A designated airline of Australia may enter into code-sharing arrangements, whether as the operating airline (i.e. to carry partner airline(s)'s code on its own services) or marketing airline (i.e. to put its code on partner airline(s)'s services), in respect of passenger, combination and/or cargo air services with other designated Australian airlines, designated Brazilian airline(s) or with third country airlines.

Brunei Darussalam

Designated Australian airline(s) may determine the frequency of service, capacity and aircraft type to be operated on the specified routes.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

In operating or holding out the agreed passenger and cargo services on the specified routes, the designated airlines of Australia, whether as the operating airline or the non-operating (marketing) airline, may enter into co-operative marketing arrangements such as blocked space or code sharing with any other airline(s).

Cambodia

Entry last amended on 23 February 2017

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

7 frequencies per week with any aircraft type to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney; and

7 frequencies per week with any aircraft type provided the service operates on both the inward and outward journey via a point that is not Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

7 frequencies per week with any aircraft type to/from all points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

Freight services

5 frequencies per week with any aircraft type.

Cooperative marketing capacity

A designated airline of Australia may enter into code share arrangements, whether as the operating or marketing airline, with a designated airline of Cambodia, a designated airline of Australia and/or an airline of a third country.

Canada

Entry last amended on 7 January 2025

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

Unrestricted capacity to/from all other points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth, Sydney and Western Sydney.

47 services per week to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth, Sydney and Western Sydney.

With effect from the start of the Northern Summer 2025 timetable period:

97 services per week to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth, Sydney and Western Sydney.

With effect from the start of the Northern Summer 2026 timetable period:

Unrestricted capacity.

Designated airline(s) may exercise full fifth freedom traffic rights at any intermediate and/or beyond points, except for points in the United States other than Honolulu and San Francisco.

Freight services

The designated airline(s) may determine the frequency and aircraft type to be operated.

Designated airline(s) may exercise unrestricted traffic rights at any intermediate and beyond points, up to seventh freedom rights.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

The designated airline(s) of Australia may enter into cooperative arrangements for the purpose of code sharing on flights operated by airline(s) of Australia, or Canada and/or of any third country. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Chile

Entry last amended on 4 February 2025

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

13 services each way each week

With effect from the start of the Northern Summer 2025 timetable period:

20 services each way each week

With effect from the start of the Northern Summer 2026 timetable period:

27 services each way each week

Freight services

The designated airline or airlines of Australia may determine the frequency, capacity and aircraft type to be operated in each direction on the specified routes.

Code sharing

The designated airline(s) of Australia may be able to perform services to/from Chile via code sharing, blocked space or other cooperative service arrangements with other airlines. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

China, People's Republic of

Entry last amended on 28 February 2017

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

Designated airlines of Australia may determine the frequency of service, capacity and aircraft type to be operated.

Freight services

There are no limitations in relation to frequency, capacity or aircraft type for dedicated cargo services between Australia and China.

Cooperative marketing capacity

A designated airline of Australia may enter into cooperative marketing arrangements with another Australian airline or airlines, with a Chinese airline or airlines, or with an airline or airlines of a third country. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Colombia

Entry last amended on 8 August 2017

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

The arrangements do not provide capacity for own-operated services.

Code sharing

Airlines of Australia have the right to enter into code share arrangements, as the marketing airline, with any other airline, including other Australian airlines or airlines of third parties.

The volume of capacity or service frequencies which may be held out and sold by designated airlines of Australia, when code sharing as the non-operating airline, is not limited.

Cook Islands

Entry last amended on 9 March 2023

Freight services

In operating dedicated cargo services on the specified route, the designated airline or airlines of Australia may determine the frequency, capacity and aircraft type to be operated.

Cooperative marketing arrangements:

On the specified Joint Services Route designated Australian airlines may enter into code sharing, blocked space and/or any other cooperative services arrangement with an airline or airlines of the Cook Islands or with an airline of the Association of South Pacific Airlines as at 1 January 1999 or with a regional airline. The designated airline(s) may determine the capacity, frequency and aircraft type to be operated.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

In operating or holding out international air transportation the designated airlines of Australian shall have the right, over all or any part of their specified route to enter into code share, blocked space, or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the operating and/or marketing airline, any other airline, including other Australian airlines and third-party airlines.

Croatia

Entry last amended on 16 March 2007

Passenger services

7 services each way each week with any aircraft type

The aeronautical authorities will favourably consider requests from designated airlines to operate services in addition to the above entitlements provided that they are operated to points in the Republic of Croatia other than Zagreb, Dubrovnik and Split.

Freight services

The designated airline(s) may determine the capacity, frequency and aircraft type to be operated.

Code sharing

The designated airlines of Australia have the right, over all or part of their route, to enter into code share, blocked space or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the marketing and/or operating airlines with any other airline, including airlines of the same side and of a third country. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Cyprus

Entry last amended on 27 June 2017

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

Unrestricted capacity, frequency and aircraft type to/from Larnaka and/or Pafos

Freight services

A designated airline may determine the frequency of service, capacity and aircraft type to be operated.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

A designated airline of Australia, whether as the operating or non-operating airline, may enter into cooperative marketing arrangements such as blocked space or code sharing with:

- (a) any airline or airlines of Australia or Cyprus;
- (b) any airline or airlines of a third country;
- (c) any surface (land and maritime) transport provider.

The volume of capacity or service frequencies which may be held out and sold by designated airlines of Australia, when code sharing as the non-operating airline, is not limited.

Czech Republic

Entry last amended on 8 August 2005

7 services per week with any aircraft type between Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney and the Czech Republic:

There is no limit on the number of services that may be operated between all points in Australia other than Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney and the Czech Republic.

Freight services

There is no limit on the number of services that may be operated.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

A designated airline of Australia can, over all or part of the specified route, enter into code share, blocked space or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the marketing and/or operating airline, with any other airline, including other designated airlines of Australia and of third parties. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Denmark

Entry last amended on 28 July 2003

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

2800 seats per week.

Freight services

The designated airline or airlines may determine the frequency of service, capacity, and aircraft type to be operated.

Cooperative marketing arrangements

A designated airline of Australia, whether as the operating or non-operating airline, may enter into cooperative marketing arrangements such as blocked space or code sharing with:

- (a) an airline or airlines of Australia;
- (b) an airline or airlines of Denmark; or
- (c) an airline or airlines of a third country.

Ecuador

Entry last amended on 21 August 2017

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

The arrangements do not provide capacity for own-operated services.

Code sharing

The designated airlines of Australia have the right, on all or part of their routes, to enter into code share, blocked space or other cooperative marketing arrangements, as the marketing airline, with any other airline, including other Australian airlines or airlines of third parties.

Egypt

Entry last amended on 17 December 2012

Designation status: multiple

Available capacity

Passenger services

7 weekly frequencies between points in Australia and points in the Arab Republic of Egypt except for services operated in accordance with the below:

Services between all international airports in Australia (other than Brisbane, Melbourne (including Avalon), Perth and Sydney) and eight (8) airports in Egypt (Luxor, Hurghada, Aswan, Sharm-el-Sheikh, Taba, St. Catherine, Marsa Alam and El Alamein) may be operated without frequency or capacity limitation.

Freight services

1 weekly cargo flight.

Code sharing arrangements

Any designated airline of Australia may enter into code sharing arrangements with another Australian airline or airlines, with an Egyptian airline or airlines, or with an airline or airlines of a third country. Further information about the conditions applying to such arrangements can be obtained from the Department.

Ethiopia

Entry last amended on 5 February 2019

Available capacity

Passenger services

7 frequencies per week to/from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney.

Freight services

Up to 7 frequencies per week.

Cooperative marketing arrangements
