

Mobile, landline, and internet services keep us connected, but they may not be available in a natural disaster. It is important that you have backup options.

Use this checklist to prepare for unexpected outages in an emergency or natural disaster:

Prepare an emergency kit to take with you if you need to leave during a natural disaster.		Prepare and communicate your emergency plans to family and friends before you have to act on them.
Include a portable battery-powered radio with a spare set of batteries in your emergency kit so you can stay connected		Keep a paper copy of your family and friends' contact details so you have them even if you can't recharge your phone.

Know where to go for help when communications go down, like community centres or hubs and neighbours you can trust		you receive them.
		While you can, monitor radio and television stations, emergency services websites, and social media for up-to-date warnings and information.
Keep your mobile phone charged and		
have a backup power source, like a battery pack.		If you find yourself without telecommunications in an emergency, don't wait for a warning. Get ready and leave early if you think the situation is getting worse.
Consider packing some cash in your emergency kit, as a bank card and ATMs may not be working.
