I write regarding the DSAPT Transport Review. Please take this email as my submission calling for Braille to be placed in the Transport standards.

- 1. Braille was removed from all taxi doors over a Three/Four-Week Period here in Queensland.
- 2. Braille should not have been removed. The Transport Standards refer to large print Numbering/Lettering. This is useless for a totally Blind user. Totally Blind users of Transport rely on Braille to read to identify the type of Vehicles and the number of Vehicles.
- 3. I would Strongly request that Braille is included into the DSAPT Standards so totally Blind users can identify Vehicles and can travel safely once again.
- 4. There was no consulting by taxi companies when they removed the Braille Numbering from Taxi doors in Queensland. They thought they new best and did not listen or consult with people with disability.

Braille should be included once again and I hope that my submission goes a long way for Braille to be included for the numbering of Vehicles once again.
