



Instruction sheet 2.1—SMS Relay—making a call

Step-by-step instructions

Step number	Image	Instruction	
1		Send an SMS to 0423 677 767 .	
2		 Include this information in the SMS: area code and number you wish to call your name name of person you are calling message for the other person ask for a response to your message if you want one GA (Go ahead) at end of message. 	
3		Wait for an automated welcome message from the NRS to confirm that the SMS has been received.	
4		Wait to be transferred to a relay officer (RO). Wait for the RO to dial number and relay your message to the other person.	
5		Wait for text greeting and response from the other person. Wait for GA at end of message.	
6	層	If you need to respond, send another message. Type GA at end of your message if you want the other person to respond or type SKSK (Stop Keying. Stop Keying) if you have finished your call.	
7	***	Read SKSK from the other person. The call is finished.	

Step number	Image	Instruction
8	***	Read 'RO here, would you like to make another call? GA'.
9		If yes, send a reply SMS with the phone number you want to call and details of the message (see step 2).
10		If no, send reply SMS 'no thanks'. Read goodbye message from RO.

- E.g. Which time is best: 10am or 4pm? Rather than: Can we change the time?
- If you don't respond within two minutes, the relay officer will ask for a response. If there is no response after another two minutes, then they will end the call.
