Dear Sir,

Council received your correspondence in relation to the review of the National Airports Safeguarding Framework (NASF) regarding its implementation in land use planning. It is understood that the National Airports Safeguarding Advisory Group (NASAG) is seeking "*submissions from interested key stakeholders on how the NASF has been/is being implemented since its introduction in 2012*".

We understand that Mr. Tom Orr and Ms Davina Baird of the Department of Transport and Main Roads are Queensland representatives within your group. We understand that in Queensland local planning schemes must address the State Planning Policy matters for the preparation of local planning instruments. We do not specifically make separate references in scheme drafting to the National Airports Safeguarding Framework. There is no need to make separate reference to the Framework in Queensland. Queensland implements the National Airports Safeguarding Framework via the State Planning Policy (SPP) Strategic Airports and Aviation Facilities state interest which local governments integrate into planning schemes, where relevant.

Any future changes to Queensland's future policy development agenda will no doubt be rolled out across the state via the Strategic Airports and Aviation Facilities state interest.
