1 Name

This instrument is the Navigation (Live Animal Transport—At Shuwaikh) Exemption 2020.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences the day after it is made.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under section 334 of the Navigation Act 2012.

4 Definitions

Note:

Because of section 46AA of the Acts Interpretation Act 1901, a number of expressions used in this instrument are defined in that Act, including 'Minister' and 'Department'. At the time this instrument was made, a reference to 'the Department' is a reference to the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications.

In this instrument:

Act means the Navigation Act 2012.

Agriculture Department means:

- (a) the Department administered by the Minister administering the Export Control Act 1982;
- (b) despite paragraph (a), if section 3 of the Export Control Act 2020 has commenced—the Department administered by the Minister administering that Act.

approved arrangement:

- (a) has the same meaning as in the Export Control (Animals) Order 2004;
- (b) despite paragraph (a), if section 3 of the Export Control Act 2020 has commenced—has the same meaning as in the Export Control Act 2020.

livestock operator has the same meaning as in Marine Order 43.

Marine Order 43 means Marine Order 43 (Cargo and cargo handling – livestock) 2018.

vessel means the vessel specified in subsection 5(1).

5 Exemption

- (1) This section applies to the vessel Al Shuwaikh.
- (2) The vessel is exempt:
 - (a) from the application of the provisions of Marine Order 43 specified in subsection (3);
 - (b) for the periods specified in subsection (4);

- (c) subject to the conditions specified in section 6.
- (3) The following provisions of Marine Order 43 are specified for the purpose of paragraph (2)(a):
 - (a) section 21;
 - (b) section 2.4(3) of Schedule 2.

Note: The exemption in paragraph (b) has the effect that the vessel is taken to comply with Schedule 2 (and thus with the requirement in section 35 of Marine Order 43) despite not complying with section 2.4(3) of Schedule 2.

- (4) The following periods are specified for the purpose of paragraph (2)(b):
 - (a) the period from the day after this instrument is made and ending 31 July 2022.

6 Conditions

- (1) The conditions in this section are specified for the purpose of paragraph 5(2)(c).
- (2) The conditions in this section apply to a person (a *responsible person*) who is or was, during the periods, voyages and operations specified in subsection 5(4):
 - (a) an owner of the vessel; or
 - (b) a master of the vessel; or
 - (c) a charterer of the vessel; or
 - (d) a livestock operator in relation to the vessel.
- (3) Each responsible person must ensure that:
 - (a) livestock other than sheep are not carried on the vessel on decks with more than 1 tier; and
 - (b) where livestock is carried in single tier areas of the vessel, the mechanical ventilation system provides air from a source of supply, with a velocity across pens in the area of at least 0.5 ms⁻¹.
- (4) Each responsible person must act consistently with the plan to meet Marine Order 43 requirements in the near future set out in Schedule 1, other than to the extent approved in writing by the Minister or an SES employee in the Department.
- (5) Each responsible person must, other than to the extent approved in writing by the Minister, an SES employee in the Department or an SES employee in the Agriculture Department:
 - (a) ensure that all livestock carried on the vessel during the periods specified in subsection 5(4) meet all of the following requirements:
 - (i) an approved arrangement for the person intending to export the livestock (the *exporter*) is in effect in relation to the livestock;
 - (ii) the approved arrangement includes a twin tier animal welfare management plan; and
 - (b) take all actions necessary to ensure the exporters comply with the approved arrangements; and

- (c) not take any action that would result in the exporters failing to comply with the approved arrangements.
- (6) Each responsible person who is aware, or believes it is likely, that a condition in this section has been or will be contravened must notify the Minister of this fact as soon as reasonably practicable.
- (7) If the Minister gives each responsible person a notice in writing requesting that they show cause why this instrument should not be revoked:
 - (a) each responsible person who wishes to respond to the notice must do so within 14 days of the date on which it was given; and
 - (b) each responsible person must ensure that the vessel does not commence any voyage or operation involving the carriage of sheep until the Minister has notified them, in writing, of his or her decision about whether the instrument is to be revoked.

Note 1: Contravention of a condition is an offence under section 335 of the Act.

Note 2: Contravention of a condition may lead to revocation of this instrument.

7 Repeal


This instrument is repealed on the sooner of:

- (a) the day after an SES employee in the Department provides written notice to each responsible person (within the meaning of section 6(2)) that all of the conditions in section 6 have been met; or
- (b) 31 July 2022

Note: This section does not limit the Minister's general power to revoke this instrument.

Hi 47F

I understand the *Maysora* may be intended to carry livestock for a voyage in March. I wanted to check in with you about the status of LSS' expected application to the Deputy Prime Minister for an exemption from the twin tier decking and associated ventilation requirements under Marine Order 43.

With a view to efficient processing of your expected application, I wanted to follow up on a few matters:

- Approval timeframes as previously advised, once you have settled an animal welfare management plan
 with the Department of Agriculture, the sooner you submit a formal application to the Office of the Deputy
 Prime Minister the better. It may well take a couple of weeks to progress the application and exemption
 instrument (subject to approvals), assuming we have no questions or comments, and subject to the Deputy
 Prime Minister's travel and availability.
- Milestones to meet MO43 as previously advised, I suggest you specify a series of milestone dates for the Maysora's in advance of submitting an application to the Deputy Prime Minister, I would be happy to assist with further comments on a draft schedule of milestones if/when you have one ready.

Coverage of the exemption — in line recent comments by the Deputy Prime Minister in Parliament, any exemption would only relate to twin-tier decks used for carrying sheep, and the associated ventilation; it would not apply to the ship as a whole. Single tier decks would need to meet the requirements of Marine Order 43 to carry any livestock, including the 0.5m/s air distribution requirement. I understand AMSA has recently contacted at Mira Shipping to confirm whether ventilation on the *Maysora's* single tier decks meets this standard.

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
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



 - (d) a livestock operator in relation to the vessel;
 - (b) Mira International Shipping S.A.
- (3) Each responsible person must ensure that:
 - (a) livestock other than sheep are not carried on the vessel on decks with more than 1 tier; and
 - (b) where livestock is carried in single tier areas of the vessel, the mechanical ventilation system provides air from a source of supply, with a velocity across pens in the area of at least 0.5 ms⁻¹.
- (4) Each responsible person must act consistently with the plan to meet Marine Order 43 requirements in the near future set out in Schedule 1, other than to the extent approved in writing by the Minister or an SES employee in the Department.
- (5) Each responsible person must, other than to the extent approved in writing by the Minister, an SES employee in the Department or an SES employee in the Agriculture Department:
 - (a) ensure that all livestock carried on the vessel during the periods specified in subsection 5(4) meet all of the following requirements:

- (i) an approved arrangement for the person intending to export the livestock (the *exporter*) is in effect in relation to the livestock;
- (ii) the approved arrangement includes a twin tier animal welfare management plan; and
- (b) take all actions necessary to ensure the exporters comply with the approved arrangements; and
- (c) not take any action that would result in the exporters failing to comply with the approved arrangements.
- (6) Each responsible person who is aware, or believes it is likely, that a condition in this section has been or will be contravened must notify the Minister of this fact as soon as reasonably practicable.
- (7) If the Minister gives each responsible person a notice in writing requesting that they show cause why this instrument should not be revoked:
 - (a) each responsible person who wishes to respond to the notice must do so within 14 days of the date on which it was given; and
 - (b) each responsible person must ensure that the vessel does not commence any voyage or operation involving the carriage of sheep until the Minister has notified them, in writing, of his or her decision about whether the instrument is to be revoked.

Note 1: Contravention of a condition is an offence under section 335 of the Act.

Note 2: Contravention of a condition may lead to revocation of this instrument.

7 Repeal

This instrument is repealed on the sooner of:

- (a) the day after an SES employee in the Department provides written notice to each responsible person (within the meaning of section 6(2)) that all of the conditions in section 6 have been met; or
- (b) 31 December 2021

Note: This section does not limit the Minister's general power to revoke this instrument.
