Domestic and Family Violence Support in response to Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Background

Times of crisis can increase the risk of violence against women and their children. As part of the Australian Government's response to Coronavirus, \$150 million funding has been announced to support Australians experiencing domestic, family and sexual violence due to the COVID-19 situation.

The Council of Australian Governments (COAG) had also established the Women's Safety Council, with relevant ministers from the Commonwealth and each state and territory. The COAG Women's Safety Council will meet monthly to coordinate how funding will be delivered to best support local responses to this issue. Responding to challenges of supporting women and children in regional and remote locations is one of the Council's priorities.

\$20 million has been committed to Commonwealth-funded initiatives including 1800RESPECT, MensLine and a new national information campaign with clear information on where Australians experiencing violence during this period can access support.

There is free and confidential help available at all hours, every day. Support and advice is also available for family and friends of those experiencing domestic violence and abuse.

Help is Here Campaign

The Help is Here campaign, which was launched on 3 May 2020, includes advertising across television, digital, social media, radio, magazines and newspapers as well as in shopping centres, hospitals and GP surgeries.

The new awareness campaign directs women and men to the two national helplines - 1800RESPECT and MensLine Australia - where they could talk directly and confidentially with trained counsellors via online chat or phone.

The campaign had two clear messages – that help is here and tough times do not excuse tougher times at home. It makes it clear that violence and abuse are never acceptable, no matter the circumstances
