INTERPRETATION

<u>Australian Design Rule No.22A - Head restraints</u>

as endorsed by the Australian Transport Advisory Council – July 1973.

Interpretation No. 1 (Clause 22.2.2)

Question: May a head restraint capable of being removed from the seat back without the use of

tools be considered as suitable for the purposes of the Rule?

Answer: Yes, as long as the design features are such that, for any position of its adjustment,

the location and extent of the prescribed impact surface satisfy the parameters of

Clause 22.2.2.
