



# Land Transport Industry – COVID-19 Response Update 17 November 2020

The Land Transport Industry (Industry) is playing a critical role during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, highlighting the importance of the Industry in supporting Australian communities and the economy by providing essential supplies of food, medicine and other goods. To maintain the safety of Industry members and the wider community, operators must continue to adhere to best practice health advice for cleaning, hygiene and physical distancing.

This update is a part of the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications' (the Department) continuing ongoing engagement with Industry, regulators, other Commonwealth agencies and state and territory governments as we move towards recovery.

## Recent Updates

### Freight Movement Code Update

As border restrictions change across Australia, the Freight Movement Code for Domestic Border Controls will continue to be an important means for government and industry to manage COVID-19 transmission risks. The Australian, State and Territory Governments reaffirm the importance of social distancing, record keeping, COVIDSafe work plans and not working while symptomatic. Transport agencies are currently working with Industry and Health agencies to review best practice for a-symptomatic COVID-19 testing.

### Jurisdictions Border Controls

As we get closer to the end of the year, State and Territory Governments have announced changes to their border controls. A COVID-19 cluster in Parafield, South Australia has also caused changes to border controls. Industry are encouraged to regularly review state and territory webpages to keep across these changes. Recent changes include:

- QLD** has declared Adelaide a hotspot. ([link](#))
- WA** has declared SA a medium risk area. ([link](#))
- TAS** has declared SA a medium risk area. ([link](#))
- NT** has declared SA a hotspot. ([link](#))

Industry are encouraged to remain vigilant and, should you experience any COVID-19 symptoms, immediately stop working until a negative COVID-19 test has been received.



## National Cabinet Update

On 13 November 2020, the National Cabinet met for the 31<sup>st</sup> time to discuss Australia's COVID-19 response. At this meeting the Commonwealth, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory agreed to a new 'Framework for National Reopening Australia by Christmas'. The National Reopening Framework builds on the 3-Step Framework for a COVIDSafe Australia agreed by National Cabinet on 8 May 2020 and sets a pathway for the removal of domestic border restrictions where it is safe to do so.

The importance of the Industry is captured in the National Reopening Framework, noting the Freight Movement Protocol and Code should continue to apply when border controls are in place.

## Close Contact Record Keeping

Under the Freight Movement Code for the Domestic Border Controls – Freight Movement Protocol (Code), industry operators are required to keep a record of all close contacts to assist with contact tracing. Record keeping is vitally important as it allows governments to quickly and accurately respond to a confirmed COVID-19 case.

Freight operators are responsible for maintaining their own close contact record and should not rely on the record keeping of premises they visit. An optional Record Keeping Form has been developed for Industry use. The Form is attached at the end of this newsletter.

## Monitoring Heavy Vehicle Driver Shortage

On 23 October 2020, the Commonwealth hosted a meeting with representatives from industry as well as the Western Australian and Northern Territory Governments to discuss issues freight operators are experiencing due to driver shortages. Whilst there are long-term skills shortage concerns, border controls have also caused challenges relocating drivers. Governments are working to address the long-term factors, but will continue to monitor any acute issues resulting from COVID-19.

## Mental Health and Wellbeing

During the COVID-19 pandemic, many Australians have experienced significant levels of stress and uncertainty. For many people across Australia, COVID-19 has had a significant effect on mental health and personal wellbeing.
